Part A: (20 points)

The polynomial regression model  $y_i = \beta_0 + \beta_1 x_i + \beta_2 x_i^2 + \epsilon_i$ ,  $i = 1, \dots, 20$  is fit with  $R^2 = 0.98$ . If the quadratic term is dropped, then the fitted simple linear regression model leads to  $R^2 = 0.90$ . Is this evidence that the quadratic model fits significantly better? More precisely, compute the  $F$ -statistic and  $p$ -value for testing  $H_0 : \beta_2 = 0$  versus  $H_1 : \beta_2 \neq 0$ , or prove that the  $F$ -statistic or  $p$ -value cannot be computed from the available information.

Part B: (30 points)

Assume a linear model  $Y = X\beta + \epsilon$ , where the error vector  $\epsilon$  has  $n$  iid  $N(0, \sigma^2)$  components. Let  $\alpha$  be a fixed vector of the same dimension as  $\beta$ , and  $L$  be an  $n \times 1$  vector of constants, such that  $L^T Y$  is an unbiased estimator of  $\alpha^T \beta$ . Show that  $L^T Y$  is the minimum variance linear unbiased estimator of  $\alpha^T \beta$  if and only if  $D^T Y$  and  $L^T Y$  are independent for every  $n \times 1$  constant vector  $D$  which satisfies  $E(D^T Y) = 0$  for all  $\beta$ .

Part C: (50 points)

To test the potency of an insecticide, beetles were exposed to 4 doses. It was believed that the potency is related to the ambient temperature, so the beetles were dosed at 3 temperatures. The data are:

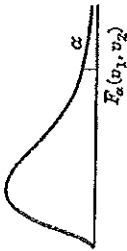

To address these issues, please (a) apply appropriate transformations to the data as needed; (b) write down your proposed model(s); (c) specify necessary assumptions; (d) perform relevant statistical analysis as you see fit; and (e) summarize your conclusions.

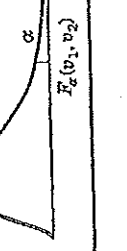
